Mark your calendars: Wednesday, October 24, 2018 at the Curling lobby, 55 Arena Rd, from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Advanced poll will be held October 16th, 2018 at the Town of Ste. Anne office, 30B Dawson Rd from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. If you would prefer a mail in ballot, please contact the Town of Sainte-Anne office at 204-422-5293.

Eligible Voters must be 18 years of age on Election Day, be a Canadian Citizen and live or own property in town as of April 22, 2018.

If you are not on the voters list don't worry. If you are an eligible voter simply bring a piece of photo identification with you to register.

We would like to remind residents of Animal Control By-Law 5-2008...
5(1) The owner of every dog and cat over the age of four months shall obtain and renew a license annually. If your pet is older than 4 months old and does not have the required license, one can be obtained at the town office for a fee of \$5.00 if your animal is spayed or neutered or \$10.00 if it is not. Dogs and cats are to be kept on a leash at all time.

Maximum Number of Dogs—By-Law 5-2008

10(1) No person shall own, harbor, keep or have in his possession or control of on his premises, more than 2 dogs and or 2 cats over the age of four (4) months

(ON YOUR RESPECTIVE GARBAGE DAY)

The Town of Ste. Anne's annual free Curbside Giveaway Weekend:

Are you doing some pre-fall cleaning and have some items in good condition that you'll never use again? Residents are invited to take advantage of this year's fall giveaway weekend on September 8th and 9th, 2018. This is a great opportunity to find a new owner for those clean and reusable unwanted items taking up space in your home or to browse the curbs for some great finds.

Tips if you are giving away items

Place unwanted household items at the curb on your front street.

Label each item with a FREE sticker or sign.

Store items out of sight that you don't want to give away.

Remove leftover items from the curb by dusk on Sunday. (any items left at the curb will be picked up by public works personnel and presumed to be garbage)

Examples of giveaway items include:

Books, CDs and DVDs

Furniture, electronics and small appliances

Sports equipment and toys

Yard and gardening tools and equipment (e.g., lawn mowers, snow blowers, rakes, shovels)

Kitchen gadgets, dishes, cutlery, pots and pans

Unwanted gifts

Construction materials (e.g., nails, paint, wood)

Clothing

Please do not put out:

Items that could be unsafe

Items that could harbour bed bugs (e.g., mattresses, furniture, bedding)

Toilets (with a flush volume of 13 litres or more)

Tips if you are cruising the curbs looking for treasures

Take only the items at the curb marked "FREE." Don't walk or drive on private lawns or gardens.

Don't discard any items on private property.

Obey the traffic laws at all times (e.g., don't block traffic, park illegally or block driveways with your vehicle).

**Bulky Waste pick up:**

On September 11th & 14th, 2018 on your respective garbage day, the town will accept/pick up bulky waste. What is considered bulky waste: "an item or thing having weight which exceeds 32kgs (75 lbs.) or a total dimension which exceeds 3 cubic meters (7 cubic yards) and without limiting the generality of the foregoing includes appliances, furniture, auto parts, large crates."

****Tires are excluded from pick up****

All info regarding Garbage is available on the website. By-Law 14-2014.

Yard waste will be changed to the following days due to holidays:

August 6th, 2018 Yard waste will be changed to August 7, 2018.

September 3rd, 2018 Yard waste will be changed to September 4th, 2018.

October 8th, 2018 Yard waste will be changed to October 9th, 2018.
