INFORMATION FROM YOUR MUNICIPAL OFFICE...

Property Taxes 2018

Reminder that taxes are due on July 31st, 2018. **We are now accepting payments by Debit, cheques and cash.** You also have the option of dropping off payment in the drop box located in the front of the building at the Town of Sainte-Anne office.

We would like to remind residents of Animal Control By-Law 5-2008...

5(1) The owner of every dog and cat over the age of four months shall obtain and renew annually, a license to keep the dog and cat shall require the payment of the annual fee... If your pet is older than 4 months old and does not have the required license, one can be obtained at the town office for a fee of \$5.00 if your animal is spayed or neutered or \$10.00 if it is not.

Outdoors, cats and dogs are to be kept on a leash at all time.

Maximum Number of Dogs—By-Law 5-2008

10(1) No person shall own, harbor, keep or have in his possession or control of on his premises, more than 2 dogs and or 2 cats over the age of four (4) months

ANNUAL PUBLIC NOTICE

Additions to the Voters List and/or Personal Security Protection Requests

In accordance with Section 36 of *The Municipal Councils and School Boards Election Act* (MCSBEA), the Town of Ste. Anne Voters List is open for changes or revisions.

- Any person who is eligible to vote in municipal elections in the Local Authority of the Town of Ste. Anne can have his or her name added to the Voters List or have any information about the voter on the Voters List corrected.
 - Any person can request to have his or her name and address obscured from the Voters List. A person whose name has been obscured will receive a Personal Security Certificate and identification number. In a civic election, that person may only vote by Sealed Envelope Ballot and cannot vote in person at the regular or advance voting places.
- To implement the above, a written request must be submitted to the Senior Election Official, in person, by e-mail, fax or mail to:

Ste. Anne Sr. Aces Claim GOLD

Imagine defending your League Title for a third year, then going on to provincials to claim a first ever Provincial Title for your organization. This was a reality for our Sr. Aces this past 2017-18 season, and I caught up with a few of them to ask some questions. With a final score of 5-3 over the Carmen Beavers the Aces claimed a first ever provincial title, making history in their league! Claiming the CSHL Champion banner for a third time in a row is something no other team has been able to accomplish before them. The Sr. Aces have gone to provincials the last two years, but this year they won.

After finishing 2nd place during regular season, the Aces couldn't seem to get the edge over the Grunthal Red Wings. They did finally beat them in the league playoff round that went to game 6, and ended with an OT goal scored by Harms.

I asked Head Coach Kevin Lansard what it meant to the association to claim a first ever provincial title, especially after winning 3 league titles in a row? "It was three years in the making, ever since being at provincials three years back, our goal became a provincial championship and we've been putting the pieces in place to be able to get to this point. There was a lot involved in getting us here, and we did it. To win the way we won, competing with teams as big as we were playing is a bit overwhelming, and even now I don't think its fully set in yet that we've got this provincial title. We've got a really great team, and great Management behind us that work tirelessly behind the scenes to roll out a season like we've had. I'm really proud of this team, we've got a great thing going."


Third time defending goalie, Guy St. Vincent, said it was only a matter of time that the provincial Banner came to Ste. Anne. "I think the first year we were just extremely happy with winning the league title. That provincials was an extra bonus, and our 2nd year winning the league championship was great, but we were after that provincial title, and missing some very important players. This year we knew we had a good team going in, and the pieces in place and didn't fall short. It's a pretty awesome feeling sharing it with this great group of guys. "

Captain of the Sr. Aces, Stephane Pattyn, has been back for all three years they've won their league. "It's been a story in the making for sure. We have great leadership throughout the whole organization. The countless hours our head coach and General Manager put in are critical to a season like we've had. We've brought back a culture that existed when our fathers and grandfathers were involved and it feels really good to be apart of it. We've regained community support, and volunteers helping at games and are proud of being role models to the kids in this community, which is how I remember it being when I was growing up watching the Sr. Aces play. "

I asked about how the Broncos tragic accident may have come into play, as the accident occurred during the Aces provincial run. Pattyn said "Having such a tragedy occur really hit home for a lot of the guys on our team. A good majority of us played at a level where we spent a lot of time on a bus and experienced the junior hockey lifestyle. We did spend time talking about it before and after games and quite honestly, that's probably what helped me most. The worldwide hockey family is a tight one and that becomes extremely obvious when unfortunate circumstances such as these occur. It was nice to have teammates to talk it out with. We were motivated to come out as provincial champs and I think that really brought us closer and possibly gave us some extra jump on the ice. "

St. Vincent says "With the Broncos incident, it brought us closer as a team. Everybody had a tie to the Broncos in some way or another whether it was through a player or ex-player, a brother, a family member ect...it gave us an opportunity to talk about it amongst each other and share stories about our bus trips growing up and how when you stepped on a bus you didn't worry about anything else but the game that night and you were living the hockey dream, and the only focus you had was to win the next game, so your safety was never really a concern but now with this happening it brings everything to light that it doesn't matter where you are...life is extremely precious.

The Town of Ste. Anne's annual free Curbside Giveaway Weekend:

Are you doing some pre-fall cleaning and have some items in good condition that you'll never use again? Residents are invited to take advantage of this year's fall giveaway weekend on September 8th and 9th, 2018. This is a great opportunity to find a new owner for those clean and reusable unwanted items taking up space in your home or to browse the curbs for some great finds.

Tips if you are giving away items

Place unwanted household items at the curb on your front street.

Label each item with a FREE sticker or sign.

Store items out of sight that you don't want to give away.

Remove leftover items from the curb by dusk on Sunday. (any items left at the curb will be picked up by public works personnel and presumed to be garbage)

Examples of giveaway items include:

Books, CDs and DVDs

Furniture, electronics and small appliances

Sports equipment and toys

Yard and gardening tools and equipment (e.g., lawn mowers, snow blowers, rakes, shovels)

Kitchen gadgets, dishes, cutlery, pots and pans

Unwanted gifts

Construction materials (e.g., nails, paint, wood)

Clothing

Please do not put out:

Items that could be unsafe

Items that could harbour bed bugs (e.g., mattresses, furniture, bedding)

Toilets (with a flush volume of 13 litres or more)

Tips if you are cruising the curbs looking for treasures

Take only the items at the curb marked "FREE." Don't walk or drive on private lawns or gardens.

Don't discard any items on private property.

Obey the traffic laws at all times (e.g., don't block traffic, park illegally or block driveways with your vehicle).

**Bulky Waste pick up:**

On May 15th & 18th, 2018 and September 11th & 14th, 2018 on your respective garbage day, the town will accept/pick up bulky waste. What is considered bulky waste: "an item or thing having weight which exceeds 32kgs (75 lbs.) or a total dimension which exceeds 3 cubic meters (7 cubic yards) and without limiting the generality of the foregoing includes appliances, furniture, auto parts, large crates."

****Tires are excluded from pick up****

All info regarding Garbage is available on the website. By-Law 14-2014.

With spring weather upon us, it is encouraged to help clean up the town and start with our own yards to ensure a pleasing look for our neighbors. Reminder derelict vehicles are not allowed as per the unsightly property and derelict vehicles By-law 10-2011.
