We would like to remind residents of Animal Control By-Law 5-2008...
5(1) The owner of every dog and cat over the age of four months shall obtain and renew a license annually. If your pet is older than 4 months old and does not have the required license, one can be obtained at the town office for a fee of \$5.00 if your animal is spayed or neutered or \$10.00 if it is not.

Dogs and cats are to be kept on a leash at all time

Maximum Number of Dogs—By-Law 5-2008

10(1) No person shall own, harbor, keep or have in his possession or control of on his premises, more than 2 dogs and or 2 cats over the age of four (4) months

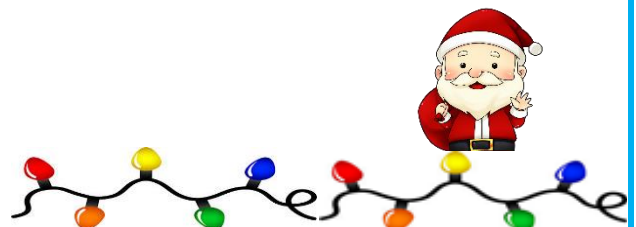

Sainte-Anne Police Department

The men and women of the Sainte Anne Police take great pride in being small town police officers. For us this job is more than simply catching criminals. We are not only deeply committed to the safety of our citizens and the protection of their property but also to the overall quality of life here in Sainte Anne. Things are changing here in Sainte-Anne. With increase in population comes an increase in crime. That’s a given. In the last ten years that I have been the Chief, I have certainly seen changes. Most of these changes have been good.

I thought it might be useful to the public to once again share our philosophy on community policing. From an enforcement perspective, the police department subscribes to the zero-tolerance policing concept. The term itself suggests a heavy-handed approach to policing; however, this is not the case. This idea is predicated on three basic ideas.

Nip things in the bud. Prevent criminals and those displaying anti-social behavior from developing the feeling that they are in charge. Strong enforcement of key areas like traffic is essential.

Tolerant control- On a day to day basis, officers needs to adopt a give-and-take attitude of decent social interaction with the community. A strong focus on problem solving and community-based policing.

Crime free environment zero-tolerance policing can make a distinct difference, directly by reducing speeding, impaired driving and vandalism and creating a community inhospitable to more serious criminals.

We are able to accomplish all this through the support of community volunteers. The Ste Anne Police Department is fortunate to benefit from the volunteer service of up to 25 Auxiliary Members! This program is run completely on donations and as such, there is no burden to the tax payers of the Town. The benefit is immeasurable. The Auxiliary members wear the distinct **blue shirts and jackets** and can be seen patrolling with the department’s regular members, also on bike patrol and foot patrol in our community. The Auxiliary members also volunteer their time at various community events, including Dawson Trail Days, Fundraising events, etc. In 2017, our Auxiliaries volunteered for over 4000 hours!

Underage consumption

Supplying cannabis to a young person under age 19 -\$2,542

Possession under age 19- \$672

Public Place

Smoke cannabis at an outdoor public place- \$672

Home growth

Growing non-medical cannabis in a residence in Manitoba- \$2,542

Provincial parks

Offence Preset Fine Amount Smoking and vaping cannabis in provincial parks- \$672

Transporting cannabis when not properly stored

Driver carrying cannabis in or on vehicle- \$237

Driver carrying cannabis in or on off-road vehicle- \$237

Consuming cannabis in or on vehicles including off-road vehicles

Consuming cannabis in or on vehicle on a highway- \$672

Consuming cannabis in or on off-road vehicle- \$672

Ste. Anne Fire Department,
 With the fall time change occurring November 4, residents are reminded to change the batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Inspect detectors and if they are expired, have them replaced. Recommended replacement dates are usually indicated on the unit. Smoke detectors should be replaced every 10 years and CO detectors every 5-7 or as recommended by the manufacturer. Dead batteries and faulty detectors are the leading cause for emergency crews responding to CO detector alarms.

Take a close look at their schedule to see if your recycling day has changed.

All residences and businesses within the Town of Ste Anne should have appropriate civic addressing numbers on their buildings. It is important to have these numbers visible in the event emergency services are required.

- Ensure the numbers are located on the front of the building in line of sight with the road
- Ensure the numbers are large enough and in contrasting colors to the building
- Trim trees and bushes that may be obstructing the view of existing numbers from the road



With winter fast approaching, all residents are reminded to have curbside areas clear for snow clearing operations. The roadway right of way is required for snow storage along the streets. Please have all summer landscaping accessories, basketball nets cleared away from the street areas. This includes the entire area up to the property lines. Thanks everyone for the continued cooperation with this.
